McDougall's Income Sources in 2023 and Future Budget Planning

Donations received from generous McDougall supporters like you covered \$340,000 (80%) of the operational expenses projected for the church by the end of 2023. Rental and fundraising income contributed another \$65,000 (15%). As approved by the congregation at the Annual General meeting in February of this year, a

portion of the McDougall surplus funds received through government grants during the COVID pandemic will be used (estimated \$25,000) to help balance our books at the end of the year. The McDougall Foundation was able to provide funding for all the extensive major repairs to the church this year (\$96,000). For this we are truly thankful.

A Message to McDougall's Congregation from Rev. Joanne Anquist

2023 has been a great year for transition. As we came out of the COVID pandemic (well it's still here, but it's no longer an emergency – we're just gonna have to figure out how to live with it!) we were able to evaluate our ministry at McDougall more clearly. There are many things that give us hope, but also some warning signs that we have to address.

As we say each Sunday, nothing happens at McDougall without you. We are a Community of Faith that has the great privilege of being called to heal the world, to be the hands and feet of Christ for all we meet. It's An awesome responsibility and not one to be taken lightly. Neither should it be a burden that leaves us anxious about whether we're doing enough. The great thing about a community is that we are all in this together, we work together for the greater good, both among us and beyond.

We know that demographics are a challenge for us – many of our congregants and donors are aging and this has an impact on giving's as well as volunteer engagement. How do we address this reality? I heard someone say the other day we need to work smart, not hard. Easier said than done! But working smart means understanding our core ministries, leaning into what nurtures us as a community while also expanding our reach to invite others to join us. McDougall does a lot – perhaps more than we should sometimes! I know many of you have been giving and volunteering at McDougall for many years, and you're tired. I hear you. We believe if we focus on what we do well, and build on our strengths, McDougall will

continue to provide a spiritual home for years to come. What are those strengths? Inside this booklet you'll see so many ways McDougall makes an impact, from Sunday morning worship, Outreach and Social justice programs, spiritual nurture opportunities, gathering to build community and pastoral care. These areas are crucial for a vibrant church. It may be that we need to become more selective in how we practice these core strengths, but, with your help, we will continue to create a faith community of care with enough resources to meet people where they're at.

The world is a confusing place. Now, more than ever, humanity needs spiritual awakening and care of the soul. We in The Church are uniquely positioned to speak into the spiritual void that seems to be overtaking so many folks. We've been doing it in one form or other for 2000+ years. Our tactics might need to change, our priorities might shift with need, but the message of Jesus that invites everyone to the Table and encourages each of us to carry each other through the joys and struggles of life is never out of date. It's not a time to throw our hands up in despair. It's time to prayerfully engage with the world with hope as we witness to how God transforms our hearts and minds, our families, our neighbourhoods our world. Thank you for all who give to McDougall. Grace and Peace to you as you carefully consider your financial commitment and your abilities to share in the joy of transforming the world!



Worship & Spiritual Development

We seek to provide a worship that is transformative and relevant to inspire our diverse community and encourage personal spiritual growth. In worship, we celebrate God's presence and respond to God's call to service in our world. Our ministers, worship service musicians and members of our Tech Team prepare the weekly worship service. We offer in-person worship on Sundays at 10:30am and special worship services at other times. All services are available online.

Adult spiritual development happens in many different ways, including personal conversations about faith, contemporary Bible study, book studies, and alternative services. In our adult gatherings, we seek to keep present the mystery of God's presence in our lives as we explore, question, and talk together. At special times throughout the year a minister meets with teens or adults who want to become members, parents who want to have their children baptized or people who wish to marry.

Going forward, we hope to create more diverse spaces for engagement. For example, this year, we will produce a podcast called **Prepared to**

Drown: Deep Dives into Evolving Faith. It will be recorded live and take the form of conversation between our ministers and special guests on a wide range of topics. Our goal is to reach people who are wondering how the message of Jesus matters in a contemporary world. This is an evolution of our Churchish and Souls in Sync programs which still have grant funding available.

The budget for the worship and Spiritual Development Ministry at McDougall includes:

- · Ministerial leadership for worship, funeral, wedding and baptismal services
- Ministerial leadership and resources for spiritual development initiatives
- · Choral and worship band leadership for worship services
- · Worship resources: communion supplies, and liturgical adornments for our sanctuary
- \cdot Sound, projection and live streaming technology
- · Administrative support: preparation of service bulletin, projection PowerPoint, arranging for service volunteers (scripture readers, usher/ greeters, communion servers)
- · Set-up, cleaning and maintenance of the worship space

Pastoral Care Ministry

Our ministers and volunteer visitors seek to make this church a caring community where each person is able to feel the love of God being shared with one another. This includes:

- Responding to individuals in times of crisis, such as illness or bereavement
- Keeping in touch with members who are unable to attend church.
- Providing monthly services at senior's residences
- Offering Healing Touch and Prayer Shawl ministries and upkeep of a Memorial Garden.
- Providing welcoming space for fellowship groups and coffee time after worship
- Providing wellness initiatives for active

seniors.

- Organizing an annual Seniors' Tea
- As post COVID conditions allow, inviting speakers on topical issues for people who are aging and exploring new opportunities for engagement between seniors and youth.

The budget for providing the Pastoral Care Ministry includes:

- Ministerial time, property costs and
- Administrative support (Office Administrator and Communications Coordinator):
 Scheduling meetings, booking space, finding volunteers and creating and distributing a monthly newsletter for those without internet access

"One of the best parts about being a member of McDougall is the sense of community. Everyone cares for each other. Recently my husband ended up in hospital while we were in Vancouver. I was originally feeling so alone waiting in the hospital but when McDougall found out I was surrounded by offers of rides, prayers and help I felt less alone. Family & Community Ministry

Rev. Danah Cox has been busy working on building collaborations within the community so that he can not only share resources (time and administrative) but bring in new people to the church.

Many individuals initially connect with the church through these community programs and then gradually become engaged in other church activities. Nevertheless, the non-profit sector currently faces financial challenges, resulting in a few partnerships falling through due to their loss of funding. This underscores the pressing need for McDougall to strive towards program self-

sustainability, a goal we've held since day one. It also underscores our ongoing reliance on the financial support of our congregation.

Outreach and Social Justice Ministry and our Affirming Ministry

As people of God, we are called to seek justice and equality for others. McDougall is an affirming church which means that we have made a commitment to Affirm United to actively live out our affirming values in our community of faith through all our church programs and ministries. We seek out partnerships with other churches and groups who have similar values and goals related to community outreach and social justice.

McDougall United Church has a strong ministry of

outreach in our community. Throughout the year, we fundraise to support special projects organized by volunteer outreach teams from our community of faith. These projects may be in our local community or farther afield. This area of ministry includes:

- Refugee Support
- Right Relations/Reconciliation Projects
- Feed the Hungry Dinner
- Acadia Food Pantry
- Christmas Hamper Program

Donations to these McDougall Outreach Projects are welcome throughout the year.
